COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

- ✓ is an alternative to incarceration in prison.
- ✓ provides services for individuals convicted of less severe offenses who are diverted from prison.
- ✓ provides services for individuals in transition between prison and parole.
- ✓ provides services for parolees released by the Colorado Parole Board.
- ✓ purpose is the productive reintegration of offenders back into society.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS BOARDS

- ✓ authorized by Colorado Revised Statute Title 17 Article 27.
- ✓ contract with the Colorado Department of Public Safety to administer funds allocated by the legislature to provide services for and supervision of offenders.
- ✓ enter into contracts with programs to provide services for and supervision of offenders.
- ✓ establish and enforce standards of program operations.
- ✓ exercise the authority to accept or reject any offender referred for placement.
- ✓ promote and protect public safety.

There are 22 community corrections boards in 22 Judicial Districts. The number of board members Statewide is more than 300. The categories of membership include citizen, Human Services, Public Defender, Probation, Department of Corrections, Division of Youth Corrections, District Attorney, law enforcement agencies, court and elected officials.

ECONOMY OF COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

The budget for FY 07-08 is \$48 million. This funds 2,998 residential beds:

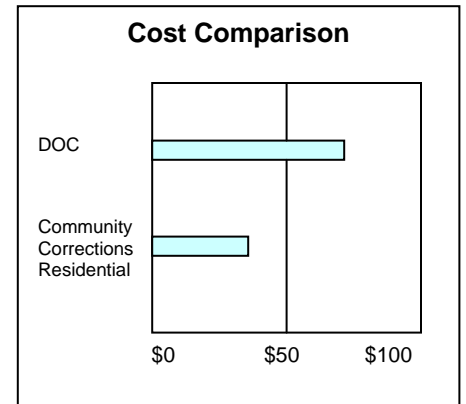
- ✓ 1297 diversion residential beds
- ✓ 1499 transition residential beds
- ✓ 10 sex offender beds
- ✓ 98 intensive residential treatment for drug and alcohol abuse beds
- ✓ 80 condition of parole beds
- ✓ 14 women’s remediation program beds
- ✓ 105 mental health differential (65 funded for 6 months beginning 1/1/08)

This budget also funds the following non-residential categories:

- ✓ 1230 diversion non-residential slot
- ✓ 175 day reporting slots

Offenders placed in community corrections are required to work and pay for their room and board, court costs, treatment programs, fines, restitution and court ordered child support. They are required to pay federal, state and local taxes and participate in offense-specific treatment. Those without a high school diploma are required to work toward their GED.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PROGRAMS

Twenty-two residential community corrections programs provide services for both male and female offenders. Four of these programs are exclusively for women offenders and four are intensive residential treatment programs. Programs are audited for compliance with State standards by the Department of Public Safety Division of Criminal Justice in conjunction with the local community corrections board.

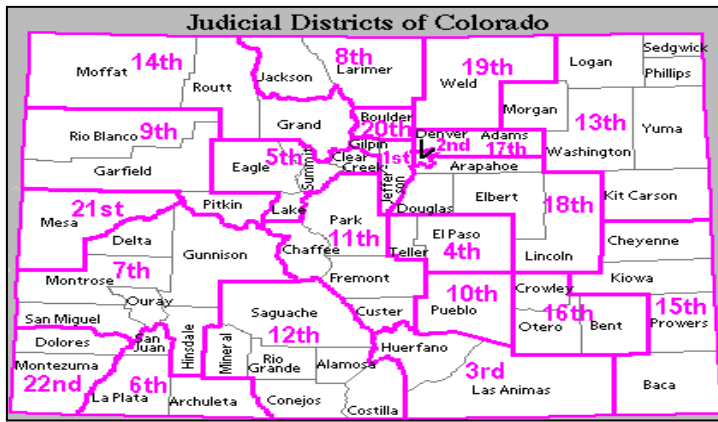
